Abstracts of the articles included as an appendix at the end of the assignment with PDFs uploaded as separate files to Turnitin 	25 marks
Question 4: Identify and state the key messages about men's health from the selected journal articles... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Compares data from a government data-reporting website ii. Discusses whether the key messages from journal articles are backed up or contradicted by findings reported in the government websites 	25 marks
Written clarity and presentation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Includes a title page with student name, number, and word count [not a coversheet] ii. Excellent structure, formatting, and layout [rubric sections used as subheads] iii. Carefully proofread with academic language is used throughout [no grammatical, spelling, or typographical errors] iv. Within word count [800 ± 10%] 	10 marks
Referencing (Deakin-Harvard) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. In-text citations and a reference list as required ii. All sources appropriately referenced in Deakin-Harvard style iii. Reference materials can include the topic content PDFs, journal articles, textbooks, and reputable websites 	10 marks
